#### Green Shirt Day—set for April 7, 2025

Green Shirt Day, in honour of the Logan Boulet Effect, in support of organ donor awareness/registration across Canada.

On April 6, 2018, Canadians were heartbroken to hear the news of the Humboldt Broncos bus crash. Of the 29 passengers, sixteen lost their lives and thirteen will all bear physical and emotional scars for life.

On April 7, 2018, Humboldt Broncos defenceman Logan Boulet succumbed to his injuries. His parents, Bernadine and Toby Boulet offered to donate his organs so that six lives could live on. They did so because Logan told his parents he was registering as an organ donor and that he was inspired by his coach and mentor Ric Suggitt. Ric passed on June 27th, 2017, and was also an organ donor and saved 6 lives.

**February 19, 2025 (EDMONTON, AB)** – For the first time, the national Green Shirt Day campaign is launching in Edmonton, marking a significant milestone in the movement inspired by Logan Boulet's selfless decision to become an organ and tissue donor. The event highlights the powerful impact of the **Logan Boulet Effect**, which has inspired hundreds of thousands of Canadians to register as organ and tissue donors since 2018 and continues to spark life-saving conversations about organ donation. At today's event, Logan's family officially unveiled the winning design of the 2025 Green Shirt Day T-shirt, selected from a national competition. The dynamic image of Logan taking a slap shot was created by artist **Geoffrey Kehrig**, a registered organ and tissue donor who grew up in **Humboldt, Saskatchewan**. "After the bus crash, I purchased a Logan Boulet Humboldt Broncos jersey and I've proudly worn it while playing pick-up street hockey in my B.C. community," Kehrig shared. "I'm inspired by Logan's unselfish choices and his reverence and compassion for others.



## **Donating Blood**

Blood donation means giving some of your blood so that it can be used to help someone else. Donated blood helps people who have lost blood in an injury. It also helps people who have an illness such as cancer, anemia, sickle cell disease, Opens dialog, or hemophilia, Opens dialog.

If you donate blood before you have surgery, your own blood will be kept for you in case you need a blood transfusion. If you don't need it, your blood may be donated to someone else.

Donated blood includes red blood cells and the other things that make up the blood, such as platelets, Opens dialog and plasma, Opens dialog. Blood that contains all the parts is called whole blood.

You can donate blood at Canadian Blood Services centres or other clinics or blood banks. You may be able to donate during blood drives at your workplace.

When you donate whole blood, you give about 473 mL (1 pint). It takes about 10 minutes. The whole process—including answering questions and having a short exam—takes up to an hour.

Donated blood is tested to make sure that it's safe to use. It's also checked for its type. This makes sure that the person who needs blood gets the right type.

#### **Who Can Donate**

To donate blood, you must:

- Be at least 17 years old.
- If you are between 17 and 23 years old, you may need to meet a certain height and weight measurement.
- Be in good health.

Some people can't donate because of health or other issues. For example, you may not be able to donate if:

- You recently donated blood or a blood product. The length of time you must wait between donations depends on the product you are donating, such as whole blood or platelets.
- You don't have enough hemoglobin in your blood. Before you donate, you will have a test to check your hemoglobin level.
- You are pregnant.
- You have travelled to certain countries.
- You take certain medicines.
- You have certain health problems, such as HIV.
- You have recently been to the dentist.
- You had a recent needle stick or got a tattoo or piercing.

Having a long-term illness, such as diabetes, doesn't mean you can't donate. You may be able to give blood if your health problem is under control. But you shouldn't donate blood if you feel like you're getting a cold or influenza (flu).

Before you donate, a health professional will ask about your current and past health to make sure that you can donate. Some of these questions are very personal, so you will be asked them in private. You will be asked these questions every time you give blood, because the list of who can give blood may change, or your health may change.

Your body will replace the lost fluid in 24 hours. (It takes a few weeks to replace red blood cells.) You will have to wait a certain number of days before you can give whole blood again.

With our building filling up, we will begin to rent out the "extra" suites. The craft room will be the first one to rent out. The crafting supplies will be moved to the north common area for all to enjoy.
